


FDO nAir window elements for controlling titles

The FDO nAir program allows you to interactively control title elements, including the RollCrawl.

The following elements of the main FDO nAir window are used to interactively control titles:

1. Buttons for turning title display on/off (1). If the button is pressed (lit) titles are displayed, if it is not pressed (not lit) titles are not displayed.
2. Elements (2) for controlling specific title objects separately.
3. Buttons for loading tasks (3), located on the file pages of the title objects.






Each group of controls for a specific title object contains:

1. Button for turning the display of that object on/off (F9 – F12, ^F9 – ^F12). The button displays the name of its set title element and the name of its current task.

If the button is pressed (lit) then the object is displayed, if



it is not pressed (not lit) the object is not displayed. You can press/unpress a button by using the hotkey that corresponds to the button (F9 – F12, Ctrl+F9 – Ctrl+F12).

If the title object contains several title elements then by pressing/unpressing the button you will turn on/off all of the elements.


2. The drop-down list that contains the list of commands to control the object.
3. The loop indicator or the display counter.
4. Timer.

✓ **Important:** The distribution of the buttons between title objects is done in the Settings window of the Title objects tab.



Controlling the crawl line using buttons

Let's assume a title project with two crawl lines (the RollCrawl title elements) is loaded. The F9 button is set to a regular crawl line, the F10 button is set to the looped crawl line.



1. Press F7 (1) to allow the display of all title objects. The button should be lit.
2. To start the crawl line assigned to F9 press F9 key or the button (2).


The regular crawl line will display once and then turn off. You can repeat the crawl line by pressing its button again. The counter located under the button will display the amount of times the command was executed.



3. Press F10 to start the other crawl line. Because this crawl line is looped, it will be displayed many times until the stop command is received.




While the crawl line is being displayed, the corresponding button is lit.






4. To start the crawl line again (starting with the first message), select Reload task in the corresponding button drop-down list.



5. You can stop the crawl line by pressing the corresponding button.
The crawl line will not be interrupted immediately – the current message will be displayed until it is done and only after that the crawl line will turn off. During this time the button will blink.
6. In order to start the crawl line anew after a interruption in the drop-down list select Reload task and then press the button.
7. To immediately interrupt the crawl line double-click the corresponding button or select Abort play in the drop-down list. In this case the crawl line will immediately turn off.
8. To clear the task in the drop-down list select Clear task.



9. To load a new task into the crawl line:
 - a) go to the corresponding file page;
 - b) select the task file;
 - c) press the Load object task immediately button.The task will immediately change.



✓ **Important:** File pages for title objects need to be configured beforehand.

10. Turn of title display: press F7.
